Assemblies of God

The Power Place has voluntarily affiliated with the Assemblies of God – a worldwide cooperative fellowship functioning as a network of ministries relating laterally and sharing common interests covenantally.

The official website for the Assemblies of God is *www.ag.org*, which contains ample information regarding its history, beliefs, vision, leadership, governing structure, statistics, affiliations, and other matters of interest.

Local churches in this network operate independently once they become affiliated with the General Council of the Assemblies of God. This necessarily means:

- every church may choose their own lead pastor
- every church owns its own assets
- every church determines its own programs and ministries

The Power Place is located within the PennDel Ministry Network of the Assemblies of God. The presbytery lending apostolic oversight for The Power Place are the officers of the PennDel Ministry Network of the Assemblies of God. The candidates for these offices are chosen from the membership of the Ministry Network – a body of credentialed ministers of which members of the Pastoral Leadership Team of The Power Place are a part.

If a family member of The Power Place ever suspects that our pastor has failed morally, ethically, or theologically, then he/she is obligated to confront the pastor first (Matthew 18:15), and if that does not work, then bring along one or two mature objective leaders to help resolve the issue. If it turns out that a person refuses to stop their destructive behavior, it may be necessary to then contact the following individuals so that a prompt and thorough investigation & resolution can occur.

History: The Assemblies of God has its roots in a religious revival that began in the late 1800s. In 1914, both clergymen and laymen gathered from 20 states and several foreign countries for a "General Council" in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

From that meager beginning, the Assemblies of God affiliated network of ministries was born and now numbers over 66 million adherents worldwide (2012 statistics).
